



TONIGHT'S MUSIC

Sospiri, *Opus 70* was composed in 1914 by Edward Elgar (1837-1954). The original version is for string orchestra and harp. Sospiri is Italian for "sighs." Elgar composed this just before the outbreak of World War I. Elgar is especially revered in England as a great composer of the Victorian period. His most well-known work is *Pomp and Circumstance*, which is played at nearly every graduation ceremony worldwide.

Sure On This Shining Night was composed in 1938 by Samuel Barber (1910-1981) to a poem by James Agee (1909-1955). The original version is for solo voice and piano. This transcription of the piano part was made by Phyllis and Monty Adams. Barber was one of the great American composers of the 20th century. His Adagio for Strings is his most well known and often heard work. James Agee was also a novelist and film critic. He wound up on the wrong side of the blacklist in the 1950s.

The **Toccata** from Symphony V in F Major, Op. 42, No. 1 was composed in 1879 by Charles-Marie Widor (1844-1937). This fiery work is beloved not only at St. Pauls, but also organists and audiences around the world. The *Toccata* shows off the composing skill of Widor, the technical prowess of the organist, and the huge range of colors of larger instruments. Widor, along with Louis Vierne (1870-1937), were the great French Romantic symphonists for the organ. Vierne held the post of Organist at the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris and Widor held the same position at St. Sulpice, also in Paris.

O Come, All Ye Faithful, known by the Latin tune title ADESTE FIDELES, is definitely a carol that we sing on Christmas Eve, BUT how appropriate the words are after a separation from each other for more than a year, O come all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant... The words and music are attributed to John Francis Wade (1711-1786), who wrote the text originally in Latin. He left England in 1745 because of the persecution of Catholics. The English text was added by Frederick Oakeley (1802-1880), an Anglican priest, in the mid-19th century.

Soon and Very Soon was composed in 1976 by Andraé Crouch (1942-2015). Crouch was one of the bright lights of gospel music with many awards and a long and prominent performing and composing career. This text and rollicking music joyfully anticipates both the birth of Jesus and the second coming.

El nacimiento is from a Christmas cantata *Navidad Nuestra* composed in 1964 by Ariel Ramirez (1921-2010). Ramirez effectively made choral and instrumental arrangements of Christmas folk songs from his native Argentina. He is considered a chief exponent of Argentine folk music. His other most performed work is *Misa Criola*.

The poetry for *O Little Town of Bethlehem* has a wonderful story. Phillips Brooks (1835-1893), an American, took a trip to Israel in 1865 at the close of the Civil War. The Reverend Brooks spent Christmas in Bethlehem in 1866, and this poem poured forth in 1868 as a result of that visit. ST. LOUIS, which is the tune most Americans know, was also composed in 1868 by Louis Redner (1831-1908), a Sunday School superintendent in Philadelphia. It was composed the night before it was sung at his church, and it is the only one for which he is remembered.

Thy Little Ones, O Savior Dear was first published in 1927 in English and was composed by Johann Abraham Peter Schultz (1747-1800). He was born in Lüneberg, Germany, a baker's son. He rose to conduct opera in Berlin in addition to composing. The text was written by Hans Adolf Brorson (1694-1864). He was the son of a priest, was ordained himself, wrote many original hymn texts in Danish and, in addition, translated many German chorales. He is considered one of the greatest Danish hymn writers.

The original text for *Away in a Manger* was written by Martin Luther (1483-1546) for his own children. The English text for the first stanza that is so familiar is unattributed. The tune, MUELLER, was composed by American James R. Murray (1841-1905). He was a friend of another great 19th century American hymnodist, William Bradbury. He also fought in the Civil War.

Wonderful Peace is one of the best known Christmas carols from Sweden. It certainly expresses the longing we have to embrace the gift of peace given to us by the birth of Christ. Gustav Nordqvist (1886-1949) published his carol in 1921. In addition to composing, he was also a church musician and academic. The text by Edvard Evers (1853-1919) is his best known work. He became a parish priest in Sweden after earning his degree in theology. Norman Luboff (1917-1987) was a well known choral director and founder of the Norman Luboff Chorale, He was born in Chicago and studied with Leo Sowerby at the Chicago Conservatory. His chorale toured and he had a successful radio, TV and film career in Hollywood.

Mary Had a Baby was arranged by William Dawson (1899-1990). Dawson was choral director for many years at the Tuskegee Institute of Alabama. He was responsible, along with others of his generation like Hall Johnson, for making beautiful arrangements of spirituals that spread the performance and popularity of that music within and beyond the African American community. Tuskegee Choir gained international stature under Dr. Dawson's leadership. The text treats the birth of Jesus as both a tender infant and the "mighty God, Prince of Peace."

The text for *Joy to the World* was composed in 1719 by the famous British poet and theologian, Issac Watts (1674-1748). Watts' great contribution was setting the entire Book of Psalms poetically. This is a paraphrase of both Psalms 98 & 96. One of his most well beloved texts is *Our God, Our Help In Ages Past*. ANTIOCH was composed by George Friderick Handel (1685-1759), who also composed *Messiah*, and was adapted as a hymn by Lowell Mason (1792-1872). Mason is often referred to as the father of American church music for his contributions.

Suantraí ár Slánaitheora was composed in 1979 by Fiontán Ó Clearbhaill (1922-1981). He began his career as a railway clerk for 27 years before pursuing a degree in music and happily finishing his professional life teaching in a secondary school in Ireland. He also conducted brass bands and composed.

The story of *Silent Night (Stille Nacht)* is so sweet. On Christmas Eve in 1818, Franz Gruber (1787-1863), an Austrian church organist and choir master, faced a disaster. The organ became unplayable that day. He composed, played guitar and sang *Stille Nacht* for Christmas Eve services that night. The text was written by Joseph Mohr (1792-1848) in 1815. It has become one of the most beloved of all carols in any language.

Shine Lovely Christmas Star was composed by Mary Elizabeth Caldwell (1909-2003). She was educated at the University of California-Berkeley then continued her studies at the Munich Conservatory followed by The Juilliard School of Music. She composed a wide range of choral and instrumental music.

Pat-a-Pan is a French carol from the 16th century and the Burgundy province. It was composed by Bernard de La Monnoye (1641–1728). The carol revolves around the birth of Jesus Christ and is told from the perspective of shepherds. *Patapan* is meant to mimic the sound of the drum.
