

Our Prelude, *It Is Well with My Soul*, was composed by Philip L. Bliss (1836-1878) in 1876. He was a largely self taught itinerant music teacher. He was converted at age 12 at a revival and it was Dwight L. Moody (1837-1899), famous evangelist and founder of the Moody Bible Institute here in Chicago, that encouraged Bliss to become a singing evangelist. The text was written by Horatio G. Spafford (1828-1888) in 1873. He also gave the Bliss tune its name, VILLE DU HAVRE. The tune is the name of the ship carrying his wife and four daughters from Chicago to vacation in France. The ship sank in the Atlantic after a collision with another vessel and only his wife survived. He wrote this text *after* this loss. This arrangement was made by Colleen Henry (1946-2014), mother of Brendan Henry.

God Made from One Blood is a text written in 1991 by Thomas H. Troeger (1945-2022). Troeger was a highly respected Professor of Christian Communication at the Yale Divinity School. He was ordained and remained active in both the Presbyterian and Episcopal churches. ST. DENIO is a tune based on a Welsh ballad from the early nineteenth century. St. Denio is the Welsh name for St. Denis, the patron saint of France.

Holy, Holy - It is interesting to note that the text for this hymn draws from both Jewish and Catholic liturgy. The Jewish prayer for every Shabbat service is *Kadosh*, *kadosh*, *kadosh*, and the Catholic prayer is *Sanctus*, *sanctus*, *sanctus*. Reginald Heber (1783-1826) penned this text in 1826 just before his death. He won poetry contests at Oxford in his student days. He became a member of the clergy, and took over his father's parish. The tune, NICAEA, was named after the Council of Nicaea (325 CE) when the Church formulated the concept of the Trinity. It was composed by John Dykes (1823-1876), who created many famous English hymn tunes.

Great Is Thy Faithfulness, tune FAITHFULNESS, dates from 1923 and was composed by William M. Runyan (1870-1957). He finished his ministry in Kansas and was particularly fond of the poet Thomas Chisholm (1866-1960), who wrote this text. Runyan set 25 of Chisholm's poems to music. Chisholm based this text on Lamentation 3:22 & 23: *Because of the Lord's great love, we are not consumed.*

Hallelu, Hallelu, Praise Ye the Lord is an unattributed praise song that is ideal for children's voices. Its melody is loosely based on a Wesleyan hymn.

Down in My Heart (I've Got the Joy) was composed in 1926 by George W. Cooke (1885-1951). He was born in Yorkshire, England but immigrated to the United States where he became a minister for a group called the Great Crusaders. This is his most famous tune and text.

Joseph Medicott Scriven (1819-1886) wrote the famous text for *What a Friend We Have in Jesus* in 1855. He was an Irish immigrant to Canada. His life was full of ill health and grief, which he worked out in Christian poetry. The tune, ERIE, is also known as CONVERSE and was composed in 1868 by John C. Converse (1832-1918), who grew up in Erie, PA, which explains both tune names. He was an attorney who also composed "church songs." He studied both law and music in Leipzig before returning to this country.

Someday is the closing song in the Disney animated film *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*. The song was composed and the film released in 1996. The music was composed by Alan Menken (b. 1949), who has composed music for other well-known Disney films: *The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast* and *Aladdin*, to name a few. The lyrics were written by Stephen Schwartz (b. 1948), who is also known for successful musicals for which he has composed both music and lyrics, including *Pippin, Godspell* and *Wicked*.

O God Beyond All Praising is by Gustav Holst (1874-1934). The tune is called THAXTED, which is the main theme of the Jupiter movement from Holst's *The Planets*. It is truly a majestic hymn. Thaxted is the village where Holst grew up. It was Ralph Vaughan Williams that adapted "Thaxted" as a hymn. The author of our text is Michael A. Perry (1942-1996), who began his studies as a physicist and changed to theology.

An Irish Blessing is the traditional sung benediction of our Pastor Jeff Carlson. The text has been set numerous times by many composers. The words are translated from the original Gaelic and are unattributed. They are often said or sung at weddings or other special ceremonies.

Prelude in a Classical Style was composed in 1966 by Gordon Young (1919-1998). He composed both choral work and organ repertoire. He was born in Kansas and received his advanced training at The Curtis Institute. He became organist and choir director at First Presbyterian Church in Detroit, and was also on the faculty at Wayne State University. This is his best known work and has been recorded many times.
