



## **TODAY'S MUSIC**

Yes, there are other beautiful movements in addition to the famous *Toccata*, which we hear on Christmas Eve, from *Symphony V in F Major, Op. 42, No 1*. The symphony was composed in 1879 by Charles-Marie Widor (1844-1937). This reflective *Adagio in C Major* is the lyric movement that precedes the fiery *Toccata*. It also shows off the warmer tones available and the huge range of colors of larger instruments. Widor, along with Louis Vierne (1870-1937), were the great French Romantic symphonists for the organ. Vierne held the post of Organist at the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris, and Widor held the same position at St. Sulpice, also in Paris.

By Gracious Powers is a translation of a 1944 Dietrich Bonhoeffer (1906-1945) text by Fred Pratt Green (1903-2000). Bonhoeffer was a German Lutheran pastor and was one of the most influential theologians of the twentieth century. His anti-Nazi views caused his imprisonment and eventually his death in a concentration camp barely a month before the end of World War II. Green was one of the most prolific hymnodists as an author and translator, especially German hymns of his time. He was born in Liverpool, England, and was an ordained Methodist minister. The tune, BONHOEFFER, is an homage to the author of the text and was composed by American Herbert G. Hobbs (1934-2022). In addition to his musical training, he was also a minister in the United Methodist Church.

*Mass of Renewal* was commissioned by St. Pauls before the pandemic and composed by Joseph Thalken (b. 1962) during and after the pandemic. As he and our Music Director talked about themes he might want to consider, the idea emerged to combine parts of the traditional Latin mass texts with poetry by George Herbert (1593-1633) and a great American hymn, What Wondrous Love Is This, tune WONDROUS LOVE, as a way to also involve the congregation; all these parts come together to make a whole. As they talked about a title for the new work, the celebration of the final R, for Renewal, in our The 3 Rs theme for 2022-2023, seemed an ideal answer, particularly in light of emerging from the pandemic. The repeated refrain in the hymn *I will sing* seems particularly relevant to a theme of Renewal. Thalken has composed anthems for our Chancel Choir in the past: In the Beginning (2006) dedicated to Kurt R. Hansen, Go Forth in Peace (2010) to celebrate Pastor Tom Henry's retirement, and Make a Joyful Noise Unto the Lord (2012) in celebration of 20 years of service of our Music Director, Kurt R. Hansen. Mr. Thalken has also written chamber and orchestral music as well as original musical theater works. He has conducted both in Europe and America, and has accompanied such artists as Julie Andrews, Patti LuPone, Bernadette Peters, and Joshua Bell. His music has been premiered and promoted by such well-known singers as Elizabeth Futral, an international opera singer and former member of St. Pauls. He has been a guest lecturer at Yale University. Joe and Terry Hansen were classmates at Northwestern and even were cast as romantic leads together in a production of Gilbert and Sullivan's Rudigore.

The text for *A Hymn of Glory Let Us Sing* is a free translation of poetry by The Venerable Bede (672/3-735). He was an English monk and one of the greatest scholars and teachers of the Early Middle Ages. The translation dates from 1858 by Elizabeth Rundle Charles (1828-1896). In addition to writing many hymn texts, she also authored many books on the early Christian church in England and Germany. The tune, DEO GRACIAS, is also known as AGINCOURT. It is an English ballad that dates from the 15th century.

Advocates gathered to call for passage of the For the People Act and the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act. The 2013 Supreme Court gutted key provisions of the historic 1965 Voting Rights Act. Since then, a host of states have put forward a number of restrictive voter rights laws. Taken together these efforts to restrict voting rights and access to the polls disproportionately affect low-income workers, communities of color, senior citizens, students, people living with disabilities and veterans. For The Love of Trees and Social Justice. Trees provide for the very necessities of life itself: they clean the air and host diverse animal communities. Increasingly, they will also be important in moderating severe heat waves due to global warming. Yet, the tree canopy in Chicago ranges from 10% to 23% coverage; this is less than other regions and inequitably distributed, with low-income neighborhoods having less canopy. The City of Chicago is initiating a plan called "Our Roots" to increase tree plantings in low-income neighborhoods. It calls for doubling the number of trees planted over the next five years. There is a role we can all play in this effort; more details will be provided next week.
