





## **CREATION CORNER - provided by the Green Team How Much Plastic Are We Using?**

In 2022, Jan Dell, founder of Last Beach Cleanup, stated, "...the rate of plastic recycling in the U.S. has been about four to five percent...we do not have a lot of factories to do it. It's also very water intensive."

Eighty-five percent of plastic ends up in landfills and the rest is incinerated; yet plastic waste in the U.S. has increased by 263% since 1980, from 60 pounds per person to 218 pounds per person by 2021. This estimate is based on data gathered by Beyond Plastics and the Last Beach Cleanup.

#### UCC GENERAL SYNOD - WHAT IS GOING ON?

The 34th UCC General Synod has been meeting in Indianapolis since Friday. There have been great speakers (e.g., Rev. Nadia Bolz-Weber is scheduled to keynote on July 1 – she is well known to, and beloved by, attendees of St. Pauls weekly Bible Study), as well as inspiring worship and music. In addition, each delegate has been assigned to serve as a member of a reference committee on a particular resolution – and typically the committee hearings are now done and reports are being drafted to adopt, reject or (most likely) adopt a modified resolution. These reference committee recommendations will be voted on and possibly amended by the full assembled General Synod body on Monday and Tuesday. **Please pray** for their careful and thoughtful deliberations. St. Pauls will receive copies of what is ultimately adopted by General Synod, and will study and possibly have an open session to discuss these findings. Together we can discern how or whether we wish to give these adopted resolutions life, as we attempt "to make all things new" and serve as God's hands in the city.

Rick Peterson wrote this article about the UCC General Synod. Rick has participated in six General Synods, three as a voting delegate (as a member of the national UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries Board of Directors). Rick is currently the St. Pauls representative to the UCC's Chicago Metropolitan Association and Illinois Conference.

#### **TODAY'S MUSIC**

O Beautiful for Spacious Skies is better known to us from its title, America The Beautiful. This very nearly won the battle over The Star Spangled Banner as our national anthem. The text was written in 1893 by Katherine Lee Bates (1859-1929). She was inspired to write the text when she hiked to the summit of Pikes Peak in Colorado and was captivated by the view. The original title of her poem was Pikes Peak. The tune, MATERNA, was composed in 1882 by Samuel A. Ward (1848-1903). Charles Callahan (b. 1951) is a well-known and award-winning organist, composer and conductor with numerous published compositions. He was educated at The Curtis Institute and has served on a number of prestigious college and university music faculties.

The text for *For the Beauty of the Earth* was written by Folliott S. Pierpoint (1835-1917). In the spring of 1863, Pierpont sat on a hill above his home of Bath, England, and this text flowed from his gratitude for the wonders of nature. The tune DIX was composed by German composer Konrad Kocher (1786-1872). He was trained as a teacher and eventually founded the School for Sacred Song in Stuttgart.

How Firm a Foundation, although of anonymous origin, is a true American hymn first published in Funk's Genuine Church Music in 1832. That hymnal is part of what is often referred to as the Sacred Harp, or shape-note hymnal, tradition in our country, which began in the early 19th century. These treasures gained a rebirth during the bicentennial celebrations in 1976. Did you know that before the revival of this tune, FOUNDATION, this text was most often sung to the tune Adeste Fideles (O Come All Ye Faithful)? The text is also unattributed, but first discovered by John Rippon (1751–1836), who was an English Baptist clergy. He noted the author as "K."

The text for *As We Gather at Your Table* was written in 1989 by Carl P. Daw Jr. (b. 1944). Daw is the son of a Baptist minister and also has a Ph.D. in English literature. He has penned a number of hymn texts. The tune, BEACH SPRING, is attributed to Benjamin F. White (1800-1879) and is first found in the great American shape-note hymnal, *The Sacred Harp*, which dates from 1844.

**Panis angelicus** by César Franck (1822-1890) uses a text that is most appropriate for a communion service. It is one of Franck's best known works. Composed in 1872, Franck actually included it as part of a larger and earlier work, *Mass for Three Voices*, composed in 1860. The original was for solo voice, harp, cello, and organ. The text is from the 13th century and is by St. Thomas Aquinas from his hymn, *Sacris solemniis*, for the Feast of Corpus Christi.

The Creator Has a Master Plan was composed by Pharoh Sanders (1940-2022). Born Farrell Sanders, he changed his name after his conversion to Islam. He was a saxophonist known for creating "spiritual jazz," as well as exploring the overtones on the sax. The legendary saxophonist John Coltrane, who became a close friend of Sanders, recorded this work as an almost musical mantra and featured it on his testament album, A Love Supreme.

The text for *God Whose Giving Knows No Ending* was written in 1961 by Robert L. Edwards (1915-2006). He was a Congregational minister who focused on prison ministry, low income senior housing, and other ministries of social justice. The words are set to the famous Welsh tune, HYFRYDOL by Rowan Hugh Prichard (1811-1887) when he was only 19. We also sing this tune to the text *Alleluia! Hearts to Heaven* and *Love Divine,All Loves Excelling.* 

Craig Curry, who arranged this great hymn tune, *For the Beauty of the Earth*, is a graduate of Wheaton College Conservatory of Music and the University of Miami. He is an active composer whose arrangements and compositions have been widely performed.
