



TODAY'S MUSIC

Both the text and tune of *Just a Closer Walk With Thee* are of unknown origin. It appears in 99 hymnals and was first published in the mid-1940s. On a train trip to Chicago from Kansas City, Kenneth Morris (1917-1989), an African American gospel music composer, heard a porter singing this song. He asked the porter to sing it again so he could write down the melody and words. When it was published, Morris also added some of his own words. It likely dates back to as early as post Civil War days in African American churches. The arrangement we hear today was made by Brendan Henry.

Come Ye Sinners Poor and Needy, to the tune RESTORATION, is mined from the wonderful early 19th century American shape-note hymnals including *Southern Harmony*. Its composer and lyricist are unknown, but it was first published in 1835. The melody is characterized by a folk-like swing.

There Is a Balm in Gilead is a Black Spiritual. In the Hebrew Bible, Gilead was the name of the mountainous region east of the Jordan River. This region was known for having skillful physicians and an ointment made from the gum of a tree particular to that area. Many believed that this balm had miraculous powers to heal the body. In the book of Jeremiah, God tells the people of Israel that though many believe in the mysterious healing power of this balm, they can't trust in those powers for spiritual healing or as a relief of their oppression. For slaves in our country, crossing the Jordan River was code for escaping their bondage by escaping to the north going over rivers like the Potomac and Ohio.

All of the vocal music today – *Introit, Anthem and Offertory* – shared by Breanna and Todd Coe is from the 1971 musical *Godspell* with both lyrics and music by Stephen Schwarz (b. 1948). He is one of the great lights of American musical theater having also composed *Pippin, Rags, Children of Eden* and the score for the Disney film *The Hunchback of Notre Dame. Godspell* is based on the Gospel of Matthew and seeks to make the old story speak to the "age of Aquarius" generation.

Prepare Ye the Way of the Lord is based on Mathew 3:3.

Day by Day occurs in Act I, and encourages the faithful to remember that God loves them and to always walk with God.

All Good Gifts occurs near the end of Act I and is part of the parable of the Sower of Seeds in which Jesus likens the Word of God to seeds that will always bear fruit. When Israel Was in Egypt Land is an African American spiritual of anonymous origin both in terms of tune, GO DOWN MOSES, and text. Like many spirituals, this text has at least dual meanings. The text certainly refers to the Jews in the Hebrew Bible Book of Exodus longing for freedom from their slavery in Egypt, but the text also refers to the aspiration African American slaves had for their own freedom from bondage in our own country. Spirituals often used biblical references in order to express their oppression, plans for escape, and longing for freedom, e.g., Were You There; Balm in Gilead; Swing Low, Sweet Chariot.

From the Top of My Head was composed by Roy Hargrove (1969-2018). In his all too short life, Hargrove became one of the greats in the jazz performing and recording world. He was a composer whose principal instruments were trumpet and flugelhorn. In addition to jazz, he also performed and recorded hip-hop, R & B, gospel, funk, and alternative rock. Born in Waco Texas, he attended the Berklee College of Music in Boston for one year, but a very active performing and recording career ended his formal training. He made and contributed to numerous recordings. His 14-year battle with kidney disease ended with his death in 2018.
