





JUNE 8-15 - YOUTH MISSION TRIP

Learn to "Be the Neighbor" from Leaders on Race and Reconciliation

We are excited to invite our youth on the summer 2024 trip - a Tulsa Race and Reconciliation Week, June 8-15. This will be our second experience with youth service and learning between the UCC and the Disciples of Christ in a nationwide program called "Be the Neighbor." Tulsa Race and Reconciliation weeks are centered around a justice-focused biblical curriculum based on Luke and Matthew. Youth will have opportunities to serve with local ministries and social service organizations. Drawing from Tulsa's history of racial violence in the Trail of Tears and the burning of "Black Wall Street," youth will learn from activists and church leaders who are determined to find hope and seek reconciliation and growth rather than simply lamenting the past. Youth will look back at the history of racism to understand why and how to address racism today and into the future. They will learn about types of racism, differences between equity and equality, and the racial wealth gap. Lessons learned will be brought home and put to work at St. Pauls and in Chicago. Curtailing the use of plastic – particularly single-use plastic – is the focus of many ecological initiatives for 2024, including the St. Pauls Green Team! Single-use plastic items include: polystyrene food and beverage containers, straws, cups, cutlery, and disposable plastic bags. We use these items every day, but they are intended to be used once and then discarded, where they end up in landfills and waterways. However, individual and collective choices can add up quickly. For example, making one simple swap – such as purchasing a reusable water bottle – can spare the environment hundreds of bottles per year! Similarly, using reusable bags for shopping will obviate the need for plastic grocery bags.

TODAY'S MUSIC

I Expect to See Him is by Jessy Dixon (1938-2011), another gospel artist and composer with deep roots in Chicago. His music was beloved outside his own community and he received seven Grammy nominations during his career. He toured the world with Paul Simon after Mr. Simon heard him and the Jessy Dixon Singers at a concert at Radio City Music Hall in New York City. He also wrote music for artists as varied as Diana Ross and Cher.

Enter, Rejoice, and Come In was composed in the 1970s by Louise Ruspini (1900-2000) who also provided the text, which is based on Psalm 100. The tune borrows from the first line of the refrain: ENTER, REJOICE.

The text for *God We Thank You for Our Pancakes* is a respectful and lighthearted adaptation by Pastor Matt Fitzgerald of a text by Ruth Duck (b. 1947), *God We Thank You for Our People*. HOLY MANNA is an unattributed melody from the great American series of shaped-note hymnals from the early 19th century including *The Sacred Harp*.

Ain-a That Good News is a great spiritual from the Black American tradition. The arranger, William L. Dawson (1898-1990), was choral director for many years at the Tuskegee Institute of Alabama. He was responsible along with others of his generation, such as Hall Johnson, for making beautiful arrangements of spirituals that spread the performance and popularity of that music within and beyond the African American community. The Tuskegee Choir gained international stature under Dr. Dawson's leadership.

Let Us Talents and Tongues Employ uses a tune, LINSTEAD, of Jamaican origin. Fred Kaan, (1929-2009) wrote this text in 1975. Born in The Netherlands, Kaan became a committed pacifist after surviving the horrors of occupation during WWII (his parents were active in the Dutch resistance). He emigrated to England after the war where he became a member of the United Reform Church.

Craig Curry, who arranged this great hymn tune, *For the Beauty of the Earth*, is a graduate of Wheaton College Conservatory of Music and the University of Miami. He is an active composer whose arrangements and compositions have been widely performed. In 1838, Contrad Kocher (1786-1872) composed the original tune, DIX. He composed 25 German hymns, among them *Praise to the Lord the Almighty*.

SPECIAL MUSIC 2023-2024 "MASS APPEAL"

Mass Appeal is a way to look at one of the oldest forms of Christian liturgical worship in three very different ways. The goal is to share how the words of the liturgical Mass can be expressed in varied musical styles, but always with the same goal: expressing the spiritual joy, longing, majesty, and supplication.

Our final offering of MASS APPEAL will be Sunday, May 19, 2024 - *Gospel Mass* was composed in 1982 by Robert Ray. This wonderful setting, largely in English, marries the spiritual energy and uplift of Gospel music with the timeless words of the Mass ordinary. This gives us a chance to showcase not only the Chancel Choir, but also our incredible St. Arbucks Quartet. *Gospel Mass* will be offered in memory of Ron McCowan, our beloved Chancel Choir bass section leader for more than 25 years, who entered that eternal "home in that Rock" on March 4, 2024.
