PRAYER OF CONFESSION


God of truth, stop us from making promises and then feeling good, as if a promise were an action. Give us the faith to act. Let our *yes* to you be real.




THE LORD'S PRAYER

Petition Drive: Special Meeting of the CCPSA (Community Commission for Public Safety) on Pretextual Traffic Stops

Each day, the Chicago Police Department makes more than 1,000 traffic stops, with more than 44 percent of these stops involving minor traffic offenses (e.g., expired registration, an unlit headlight) rather than moving violations, such as speeding or driving under the influence. Officers use such stops as pretexts to investigate non-traffic-related criminal activity. However, contraband such as narcotics, weapons, guns, and alcohol are recovered in less than 1 percent of the stops. Please consider signing a petition sponsored by the Community Renewal Society and the Free2Move Coalition asking the CCPSA to hold a special meeting regarding pretextual traffic stops. If you would like to sign the petition and learn more about the issue, please seek out SPARC members who can point out Julia Ehrhardt, petition coordinator. She will be available after church in the Narthex and at coffee hour during June and July.

Avoid Single-Use Water Containers

According to the Climate Prediction Center and AccuWeather, this summer's long-term Chicago forecast projects more 90-degree days than last year. The historic average is 17 days, whereas this year experts are predicting between 22 and 27 days in excess of 90 degrees.

Consequently, during these heat waves, one should carry water at all times, making a special effort to avoid single-use plastic water containers. Eighty-five percent of this plastic ends up in landfills and the rest is incinerated. Please buy aluminum or glass containers, which can be reused and also recycled.

IRA QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

If you have an IRA and are required, or will be required, to take a minimum annual distribution (RMD) from your account, you may be interested to know that there are tax advantages to taking your distribution as a direct contribution to a charitable organization such as St. Pauls.

If the distribution is made directly from your IRA to St. Pauls, then you enjoy two tax benefits: 1) the distribution does not count as taxable income and 2) the distribution does count towards satisfying your RMD if over age 73. The gift, called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), must go directly from your IRA to the organization, and your total gifts cannot exceed \$100,000 per year. You can make QCDs after you reach age 70 $\frac{1}{2}$, which is earlier than the current RMD age of 73. You cannot make QCDs from your 401K; it has to be rolled into an IRA first.

With the 2017 changes in the tax law, some have lost the ability to itemize their deductions, including charitable contributions, and are now taking the higher standard deduction. Making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a great way to still get a tax benefit for charitable giving. If you have questions about QCDs, consult your tax or financial advisor. TODAY'S MUSIC

Our prelude today, *Adagio*, was composed by Daniel E. Gawthrop (b. 1949). He was born in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and is known for his compositions for choirs and the organ. He has received more than 100 commissions for his works. He attended both Michigan State University and Brigham Young University, and currently resides in southern Idaho with his wife.

The God of Abraham Praise is a text paraphrased from the original Hebrew and attributed to Daniel ben Judah. His dates are uncertain, but he was a Jewish liturgical poet who lived in 14th century Rome. The English paraphrase was constructed in 1770 by Thomas Olivers (1725-1799). Olivers was a profligate youth, but was converted and became an assistant to Charles Wesley. The tune, YIGDAL, that we know is also based on the Hebrew song. YIGDAL is the first word of the hymn in Hebrew and means *be exalted*.

Come O Fount of Every Blessing, to the tune NETTLETON, is from the rich American tradition of the Sacred Harp hymnals, specifically *Wyeth's Repository of Sacred Music*. The text was written by Robert Robinson (1735-1790), who began his professional life as an apprentice to a hairdresser before committing himself to a religious life.

Over My Head is another text and melody from the great wealth of spirituals. Its current version was arranged in 1981 by Verolga Nix (1933-2014), a world-class pianist and graduate of Oberlin Conservatory; and J. Jefferson Cleveland (1937-1986), one of the most important scholars of African American spirituals. Cleveland and Nix collaborated on a seminal work about African American music, *Songs of Zion*. It is actually a shortened version, including only the very catchy refrain of a longer song.

Lord, I Want to Be a Christian is another in a long line of great African American spirituals. Neither the tune or text are attributed. The origin may go as far back as 1750. The first publication to include it was *Folk Songs of the American Negro* (1907), compiled by brothers Frederick Work (no dates) and John Work (1871-1925). John Work was also the music director of the famous Fisk Jubilee Singers.

Know That the Lord Is God- About Handel's (1685-1759) name: It was common up until the late Baroque era for composers to alter their name depending on the country in which they lived and worked. Handel was born in Germany, and his given name was Georg Friedrich Händel. (Pronounced *gay-org free-drish hehn-del*). He

kept that name when he lived and worked in Italy, but upon moving to England, he Anglicized his name to that in the Offertory. In general, when listing a work of his in German or Italian, his original name in German is given. When one of his many works in English is performed, his Anglicized name is used.

The text for *Guide Me, O My Great Redeemer* was written in Welsh in 1745 by William Williams (1717-1791). He was called the "Issac Watts of Wales." He studied medicine, but became a Calvinist Methodist clergy. The translation to English was made in 1771 by Peter Williams (1722-1796), who was also Welsh and became a Calvinist Methodist. The tune, CWM RHONNDA, is a great Welsh melody composed in 1905 by John Hughes (1873-1932). Hughes composed this for a Baptist song festival in Wales.

From the Top of My Head was composed by Roy Hargrove (1969-2018). In his all too short life, Hargrove became one of the greats in the jazz performing and recording world. He was a composer whose principal instruments were trumpet and flugelhorn. In addition to jazz, he also performed and recorded hip-hop, R & B, gospel, funk, and alternative rock. Born in Waco Texas, he attended the Berklee College of Music in Boston for one year, but a very active performing and recording career ended his formal training. He made and contributed to numerous recordings. His 14-year battle with kidney disease ended with his death in 2018.
