



TODAY'S MUSIC

Our Prelude, *It Is Well With My Soul*, was composed by Philip L. Bliss (1836-1878) in 1876. He was a largely self-taught itinerant music teacher. Converted at age 12 at a revival, it was Dwight L. Moody (1837-1899), famous evangelist and founder of the Moody Bible Institute here in Chicago, who encouraged Bliss to become a singing evangelist. The text was written in 1873 by Horatio G. Spafford (1828-1888). He also gave the Bliss tune its name, VILLE DU HAVRE, which was the name of the ship carrying his wife and four daughters from Chicago to vacation in France. The ship sank in the Atlantic after a collision with another vessel and only his wife survived. He wrote this text *after* this loss. This arrangement was made by Colleen Henry (1946-2014), mother of Brendan Henry.

The Introit, *Lift Every Voice and Sing*, is the joyous refrain of a longer hymn that is the unofficial anthem of black churches and the civil rights movement. J. Rosamond Johnson (1873-1954), the composer, and James Weldon Johnson (1871-1938), the poet, were brothers who crafted this wonderful hymn together. They also wrote Broadway musicals and edited song collections as a team.

Christ the Lord Is Risen Today, tune EASTER HYMN or LYRA DAVIDICA, uses a text by Charles Wesley (1707-1788), the great Methodist theologian and hymnodist. The tune's composer is not known and is taken from a collection, *Lyra Davidica*; hence, one of the tune names. It is equally appropriate to sing this great Easter hymn on a day that has a real sense of resurrection for many at St. Pauls.

The text for *Child of Blessing, Child of Promise* was written in 1981 by a UCC pastor and teacher of theology, Ronald Cole-Turner (b. 1948). The tune, STUTTGART, was composed in 1715 by Christian Friederich Witt (1660-1716). Witt completed a huge hymnal, *Psalmodia Sacra*, the year before his death. Of its 774 hymns (!!!), he composed nearly 100. He was Kapellmeister of the Gotha court in Stuttgart at the same time that Bach was in Leipzig, just 300 miles north. An interesting side note is that Nathan Laube, world renowned organist and friend of St. Pauls, was until recently on the organ faculty at the Hochschule für Musick in Stuttgart. He has since returned to the faculty at the Eastman School of Music.

Come O Fount of Every Blessing, to the tune NETTLETON, is from the rich American tradition of the Sacred Harp hymnals, specifically *Wyeth's Repository of Sacred Music*. The text was written by Robert Robinson (1735-1790), who began his professional life as an apprentice to a hairdresser before committing himself to a religious life.

Hall Johnson (1888-1970) composed both the music and text for *Ain't Got Time to Die.* He was an author, composer, arranger, major choral conductor, teacher, and music historian who focused on recording and publishing spirituals. His students included Shirley Verrett. He was eulogized by Marian Anderson as having done more to advance the beauty and importance of the spiritual than anyone up to that time. This is another especially relevant musical and spiritual message as we celebrate a new 2024-2025 worship season on Kick-Off Sunday.

A Mighty Fortress Is Our God is arguably the greatest Martin Luther (1483-1546) hymn and encapsulates the theology of the Lutheran Church. The tune name, EIN FESTE BURG, are the first three words of the original German text. Luther's original version is almost dance-like in rhythm. The recessional hymn presents a more majestic march.

The Lord Bless You and Keep You was composed in 1900 by Peter Christian Lutkin, (1858-1931). He was the founder and first dean of the School of Music at Northwestern University in 1895. He was organist at St. Clement's Church, as well as one of the founders of the American Guild of Organists. Along with F. Melius Christiansen at St. Olaf College, Lutkin was one of the leaders of the American a capella choral movement in the early part of the 20th century. Kurt R. Hansen's maternal grandfather, John Mahard Rosborough, received his Bachelor of Music degree in 1905 at Northwestern under Dean Lutkin and was his first accompanist. This benediction was composed while Kurt's grandfather was a student of Lutkin. The text is known as "the priestly benediction," and are the words that Moses was commanded to use when blessing Aaron and his sons before the completion of the tabernacle.

The *Finale* from *Symphony No. 4 in F minor, Op 13 No. 4* was composed by Charles-Marie Widor (1844-1937) and dates from 1872. Along with Louis Vièrne, Widor was one of the great Romantic symphonists for organ. Vièrne was one of his students, as was Marcel Dupré. He was born into a family of organ builders and composed 10 symphonies for the organ. He was also the organist of Saint-Sulpice in Paris from 1870 to 1933. This *Finale* has been eclipsed in popularity by his *Toccata* from the *Fifth Symphony*, but it illuminates his brilliance as both a composer and his talent as a performer.
