



St. Pauls is in the process of converting from room names to numbers. When construction is completed, formal signage will replace the temporary signage. "Our Power, Our Planet"

Tuesday, April 22, was Earth Day, kicking off the theme "Our Power, Our Planet" and a push to triple the use of clean energy by 2030.

In the United States, President Biden's Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 encompassed the largest federal climate investment in American history. President Trump is currently freezing or trying to stop disbursed funds, putting many solar and wind programs in jeopardy. These funds were appropriated by Congress, yet they are being nixed through executive orders.

Earth Day demonstrations were held throughout the United States to express anger at the severe cutbacks, particularly within the Environmental Protection Agency. These protests are slated to continue through April 30, while the environmental movement itself is well represented among organizations planning civic action.

TODAY'S MUSIC

Craig Curry, who arranged this great hymn tune, *For the Beauty of the Earth*, is a graduate of Wheaton College Conservatory of Music and the University of Miami. He is an active composer whose arrangements and compositions have been widely performed. In 1838, Contrad Kocher (1786-1872) composed the original tune, DIX. He composed 25 German hymns, among them, *Praise to the Lord the Almighty*.

Arise, Beloved was composed in 2013 by Rosephanye Powell (b. 1962). It employs a text inspired by Song of Solomon 2: 7-13. Dr. Powell is recognised as one of the premier living composers of choral music. Drawing her inspiration from the wide variety of African American styles, she is equally influenced by works of Bach, Handel, Mozart, and Willian Grant Still, to mention a few. She is currently Professor of Voice at Auburn University.

The text for *God We Thank You for Our Pancakes* is a respectful and lighthearted adaptation by Pastor Matt Fitzgerald of a text by Ruth Duck (b. 1947), *God We Thank You for Our People*. HOLY MANNA is an unattributed melody from the great American series of shaped-note hymnals from the early 19th century, including *The Sacred Harp*.

Ain-a That Good News is a great spiritual from the Black American tradition. The arranger, William L. Dawson (1898-1990), was choral director for many years at the Tuskegee Institute of Alabama. He was responsible, along with others of his generation, such as Hall Johnson, for making beautiful arrangements of spirituals that spread the performance and popularity of that music within and beyond the African American community. The Tuskegee Choir gained international stature under Dr. Dawson's leadership.

Over My Head is another text and melody from the great wealth of spirituals. Its present version was arranged in 1981 by Verolga Nix (1933-2014), a world class pianist and graduate of Oberlin Conservatory, and J. Jefferson Cleveland (1937-1986), one of the most important scholars of African American spirituals. Cleveland and Nix collaborated on a seminal work about African American music, *Songs of Zion*. This is actually a shortened version, including only the very catchy refrain of a longer song.

Unclouded Day is originally a hymn from 1885 with both the words and music composed by Rev. J.K. Atwood (1828-1909). Atwood spent most of his career riding a circuit of churches in the Ohio Valley. He also organised many revival meetings. Shawn Kirchner (b. 1970) penned this arrangement in 2010. Based in Los Angeles, he is a tenor in the Los Angeles Master Chorale. Born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, his compositions and arrangements have been sung around the world. He did his undergraduate studies

at Manchester University and earned his Master's in Choral Conducting at the University of Iowa.

The text for *My Hope Is Built on Nothing Less* was written in 1834 by Edward Mote (1797-1874). British born Mote wrote a number of hymn texts after a spiritual awakening resulting from the preaching of an evangelical preacher. He also authored a number of Christian pamphlets. SOLID ROCK was composed in 1863 by the prolific hymn writer, William Bradbury (1816-1868). Raised on his father's farm in Maine, he developed a love for music as a child and by age 15 began playing the organ in church. Among the best known of his hymns is the children's hymn *Jesus Loves Me, This I Know.*

Down by the Riverside is another great anti-war song from the African American tradition. Both the tune and text are unattributed. Its first printed appearance was in hymnals published in the first decade of the 20th century. One of its peaks of popularity was in the 1930s before World War II and it was also popular during the antiwar movement of the 1960s. The arranger, Stacey V.
