to care for creation,


to seek justice and to resist evil,

We are not alone. Thanks be to God!





Spring and summer and their many celebrations have finally arrived. When planning gatherings, it is easy to focus on the guest list, food and drinks, and final costs while forgetting about the cost to the environment. Ask yourself how much of what I am using is biodegradable, reusable, recyclable, or even harmful to the environment? It takes far more thought to plan an earth-centered gathering. First, skip the balloons as they are not biodegradable and harm wildlife. Second, use decorations made of cloth and paper instead of plastic. Finally, plan your menu around using utensils and plates that can be reused or biodegraded. This can include wax paper squares, bamboo utensils, chopsticks, coffee filters, and cloth napkins.

TODAY'S MUSIC

I Don't Feel No Ways Tired was composed in 1980 by the Reverend James Cleveland (1931-1991). He was inspired by the exclamation of an elderly woman in his congregation. She'd had a hard life with pain, disappointment, and mistreatment "just because of who she was." She found strength in her faith, redemption in Christ, and liberation in the Holy Spirit, and her words and fortitude inspired the Reverend Cleveland. He also carried on the tradition started by Thomas A. Dorsey fusing the spirit-filled music of gospel with the energy and drive of jazz. Muzette Morgan, our longtime alto section leader and member of St. Pauls, introduced us to this song.

Come Holy Spirit Heavenly Dove is a text composed in 1707 by the incomparable English religious poet Isaac Watts (1674-1748). The signature achievement of Watts was creating poetic settings of the entire *Book of Psalms*. Among the most familiar to us is *O God Our Help in Ages Past* and *Joy to the World*. The tune, ST. AGNES, was composed by John Dykes (1823-1876), who created many famous English hymn tunes, including NICAEA, which we know as *Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty*.

All Creatures of Our God and King is a text that was adapted by Sister Miriam Therese Winter (b. 1938). She is a Catholic theologian and also a Medical Mission Sister who has worked in a number war-torn areas, including Ethiopia and Cambodia. The German hymn tune, LASST UNS ERFREUEN, dates from 1623 and was first found in a hymnal published in Cologne, Germany. It is recognisable to us as the same tune as our Festival Doxology.

Felix Mendelssohn (1809-1847), like Mozart, had a very short and artistically productive life. He was born in Germany, but a great source of his popularity was outside his home country. He was especially beloved in England. Amongst his greatest accomplishments was the revival of the works of J.S. Bach and the first "modern" performance of Bach's *St. Matthew Passion* since his death. *Elijah* is performed in England almost as often as *Messiah*, which is, of course, by another "adopted" German, Handel. This chorus, *Lift Thine Eyes*, is sung just before *He watching over Israel* in the oratorio.

Breathe on Me, Breath of God is a text composed in 1878 by Edwin Hatch (1835-1889). He was educated at Oxford, held educational appointments in Canada, and returned to England to lead a school, as well as engage in parish ministry. The tune, TRENTHAM, was composed by Robert Jackson (1842-1914). As so often happens, the tune was composed for another text, but is permanently associated with this one. The tune was named for a town near where Jackson grew up.

Come, Teach Us, Spirit employs a contemporary text written in 1990 by Shirley Erena Murray (1931-2020). She was born and educated in New Zealand. Her undergraduate degree was in music and her Master's was in French literature. She became active in Amnesty International and composed more than 100 hymns. The tune, MURRAY, is obviously taken in homage to her married name and was composed in 1993 by Arthur G. Clyde (b. 1940). He is a prominent UCC musician and editor of our New Century Hymnal (1995).

The original German text, *Helig*, was by Johann Philipp Neumann, and Schubert set it as a part of a simple yet beautiful *German Mass* in 1827. The text is a poetic setting of the Latin *Sanctus* in German.

The text for *God Who Stretched the Spangled Heavens* was written in 1967 by Catherine Cameron (1827-2019). She became a professor of psychology in California. HOLY MANNA is an unattributed melody from the great American series of shaped-note hymnals from the early 19th century, including *The Sacred Harp*.

Fugue in G minor "Little" BWV 578 was composed by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). Bach is the acknowledged master of fugue composition. A fugue is a complex version of a round, usually involving four to five layered voices using the same theme, but entering at different times and on different pitches.
