





TODAY'S MUSIC

Our prelude today, *Adagio*, was composed by Daniel E. Gawthrop (b. 1949). Born in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, he is known for his compositions for choirs and the organ. He has been the recipient of more than 100 commissions for his works. He attended both Michigan State University and Brigham Young University and currently resides in southern Idaho with his wife.

Tobias Clausnitzer (c. 1619-1684) wrote the original German text in 1663 for *We Have Gathered, Jesus Dear*. He became a chaplain to a Swedish regiment and later became Kapellmeister at St. Thomaskirche in Leipzig, the church that Bach would eventually serve. The English translation was made by Madeleine Forell Marshall (b. 1946). She is a respected academic having begun her studies at St. Olaf College. She is now on the faculty at Claremont School of Theology in California. The tune, LIEBSTER JESU, was composed in 1664 by Johann Rodolf Ahle (1625-1673). He was educated at Erfurt University and was well known as an organist, but beyond that, little is known about his life.

The text for *Love Divine, All Loves Excelling* was written by Charles Wesley (1707-1788). His brother, John, was the founder of the Methodist faith. The words are set to the famous Welsh tune, HYFRYDOL by Rowan Hugh Prichard (1811-1887) when he was only 19. We also sing this tune to the text *Alleluia! Hearts to Heaven*. This text is one of the few that is the source of a "hymn battle" over which tune to sing. The other well-known tune for this text is BEECHER.

Breathe on Me, Breath of God is a text composed in 1878 by Edwin Hatch (1835-1889). He was educated at Oxford, held academic appointments in Canada, and returned to England to lead a school and a parish ministry. The tune, TRENTHAM, was composed by Robert Jackson (1842-1914) and, as so often happens, the tune was composed for another text, but is permanently associated with this text. The tune was named for a town near where Jackson grew up.

Santo, Santo (Holy, Holy, Holy), originally in Spanish, is an unattributed Argentine folk melody. It is so simple and popular that it has been translated into at least five languages and published in 45 hymnals...so far.

De colores is a folk song from the rich resources of Mexican music. It gained wide popularity when it was sung at meetings and marches of the United Farm Workers. Our *New Century Hymnal* was the first to share it with a wider audience; the translation, however, is unattributed.

Psalm 98-Sing a New Song was composed in 2002 by Curtis Bradshaw on a commission from The Irving Chorale of Irving, Texas. It is an upbeat jazz cantata for choir, piano, bass, and drums. This morning you will hear the first movement of this five-movement work. Mr. Bradshaw received his bachelor's degree in Music Education from Northern Iowa University, which is known for having one of the nation's finest jazz programs. After graduation, he served in the U.S. Army field bands and earned his master's degree from North Texas State University, another top jazz program. In 2013, he received "Jazz Artist of the Year Award" from the Sammons Center for the Arts in Dallas. Mr. Bradshaw is the father of our congregant, Renae Bradshaw. In addition to being a composer, pianist and educator, he is also a wonderful singer. We are delighted that we can share his work with him in attendance on this Father's Day.

O God Beyond All Praising is by Gustav Holst (1874–1934). The tune is called THAXTED, which is the main theme of the Jupiter movement from Holst's *The Planets*. It is a truly majestic hymn. Thaxted is the village where Holst grew up. It was Ralph Vaughan Williams that adapted "Thaxted" as a hymn. The author of our text is Michael A. Perry (1942–1996). He began studies as a physicist and changed to theology.

God Is Working His Purpose Out is a favorite hymn of our late Pastor Emeritus Tom Henry. The text was written by Arthur Campbell Ainger (1841–1919) in 1894. The text demanded a muscular tune, which Martin Shaw (1916–1999) provided in 1951. This arrangement was made by Brendan Henry and is a perfect homage to his dad on Father's Day.
