#### The Dirty Dozen

The Environmental Working Group has identified fruits and vegetables with the highest concentration of pesticides: strawberries, spinach, greens and cabbages, peaches, nectarines, apples, grapes, peppers, blueberries and cherries. Try and buy organic if possible; always wash fruits and vegetables in running water for about a minute. Vegetables with leaves, such as cabbages, should have their outer leaves pulled off.

#### **TODAY'S MUSIC**

*Adoration* was composed by Florence Price (1887-1953) in 1951 and originally scored for organ. In addition to this arrangement by David J. Miller, *Adoration* has also been arranged for violin and string orchestra. There were actually some positive things that happened during the pandemic. The National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) encouraged its membership to use the time to research and assign students music of neglected composers like Florence Price. She was born in Arkansas, but was active musically in Chicago from 1927 until her death. She was part of the Chicago Black Renaissance. She composed four symphonies, one of which was premiered by our own Chicago Symphony Orchestra. In 2009, long after her death, a great deal of her music was discovered at her abandoned summer home in St. Anne, Illinois.

The text for *God Is Here! As We Your People Meet* was written in 1971 by Fred Pratt Green (1903-2000). Born in Liverpool, he was one of the most prominent hymnodists in Britain and became a Methodist minister. The tune, ABBOT'S LEIGH, was composed in 1941 by Cyril Vincent Taylor (1907-1992). Taylor was both a musician and a priest of the Church of England. He composed 20 hymns and edited a number of hymnals.

**Be Still My Soul** employs a tune called FINLANDIA, because the melody was composed by Jean Sibelius (1865–1957) as part of his famous tone poem by the same name that honored his homeland. The original German text is by Kathrina von Schlegel (1697–17??) and was translated into English by Scottish Jane Borthwick (1813–1897), who translated and composed many hymn texts.

*Come, Teach Us, Spirit* employs a contemporary text written in 1990 by Shirley Erena Murray (1931-2020). Born and educated in New Zealand, she earned undergraduate degree in music and her master's degree in French literature. She became active in Amnesty International and composed more than 100 hymns. The tune, MURRAY, is obviously taken in homage to her married name and was composed in 1993 by Arthur G. Clyde (b. 1940). He is a prominent UCC musician and editor of our *New Century Hymnal* (1995).

The text for *Amazing Grace* is by John Newton (1725-1807), who was a slave ship captain, but became an Anglican clergyman and fervent abolitionist. He once said that writing this text saved his soul. The tune, NEW BRITAIN, is most likely an African American spiritual and was first published in 1829. This arrangement by William Himes (b. 1949) was adapted by our own Mark Swanson. Himes, who has

more than 70 published works, graduated from the University of Michigan and has a long association with the brass bands of the Salvation Army. In addition to being a member of our Chancel Choir and married to Nancy Pifer, Mark Swanson is also Librarian for the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

*What a Friend We Have in Jesus* uses the tune CONVERSE. The text was written in 1855 by Joseph Mendicott Scriven (1819-1886). Scriven was an Irish immigrant to Canada and he often wrote hymn texts to find solace in his faith. His life was not altogether a happy one. Charles C. Converse (1832-1918) composed the hymn tune that bears his name in 1868. He also had two other pseudonyms. An American who studied in Leipzig, Germany, he returned to America and became a lawyer. He remained an active musician throughout his life.

In recent years, the music of Amy Beach (1867-1944) has been rediscovered by listeners and performers beyond the halls of academia. Her music was the first "successful" classical music composed by an American woman. Her *Gaelic Symphony* was the first symphonic work composed and published by a female composer and was premiered by the Boston Symphony Orchestra in 1896. Her music was performed widely during her life, but lost popularity with the rise of modern music. Her music has been rediscovered and appreciated for the depth of her talent as a composer. *Peace I Leave With You* was published in 1891 and was originally scored for choir and organ. Our Benediction Response is an excerpt from that work arranged for brass.

**Rejoice!** - Richard Smallwood (b. 1948) is one of the top composers and performers of Gospel music. His group, The Richard Smallwood Singers, has toured the world. He is a graduate of Howard University, which also counts former Vice President Kamala Harris and many other luminaries as alumni. He was inducted into the Gospel Music Hall Of Fame in 2006.
