

Can This Be Made at Home?

Dr. Carlos Monteiro, a Brazilian epidemiologist, has defined four levels of food processing— information to keep in mind for weight control and cardiovascular health.

- Level 1: Minimally processed foods, such as packaged frozen vegetables.
- Level 2: Ingredients such as rice or pasta, with minimal processing and requiring cooking.
- Level 3: Foods such as jerky or apple sauce, to which have been added salt, sugar and preservatives.
- Level 4: The ultra-processed items, such as chips, cookies, colas. They do not contain whole foods, only constituents, and are laden with salt, sugar and other chemicals. They cannot be made in a home kitchen

TODAY'S MUSIC

Symbiosis was composed in 2023 by Kris Hansen (b. 1995). The music expresses a collective experience of support. Kris, a member of our St. Arbucks Quartet, was raised, baptized and confirmed at St. Pauls. He is an active singer, music producer, composer, trumpet player, and keyboard player in his own group, Semi-Cycle. He also performs regularly with other bands, including, The Walters, Kweku Collins and Othersides.

Glory, Glory! Hallelujah! is a truly exuberant African American spiritual. Long time St. Pauls members will recognize it has one of our touchstone songs sung over the years on "How Sweet the Sound," our Gospel music Sunday. The arrangement we sing is by Harriet Ziegenhals (1925-2016). Ziegenhals was the Director of the Community Renewal Chorus in Chicago for many years and often collaborated with Sam Hill, beloved St. Pauls Music Director and remarkable gospel pianist from 1971 until his death in 1991.

The memorable text to *Rock of Ages* was written in 1776 by Augustus Top Lady (1740-1778). The tune name, TOP LADY, obviously takes its name from its author. Born in England, he had a conversion experience while a student at Trinity College in Dublin. He was ordained into the clergy of the Church of England and also authored many hymn texts. The tune is also often called HASTINGS after the composer Thomas Hastings (1784-1882). The date of the composition is unclear. Born in Connecticut, he authored nearly 200 hymn texts and spent his final 40 years in New York City directing a number of church choirs. In the 19th century, more hymns by Hastings appeared in American hymnals more than any other native author. *Rock of Ages* has survived and remained a constant favorite.

The music for *Sweet Hour of Prayer* was composed in 1861 by William Bradbury (1816-1868), a prodigious composer of hymns with many authors, including Fanny Crosby (1820-1915). William W. Wallingford (1772-1850) composed the text in 1845. He was a blind English self-taught preacher.

Sisi Ni Moja means "We Are One" in Swahili. It was commissioned in 2015 by the Michigan State University Youth and Children's Choir and has become quite popular and widely performed. The lyrics call all of us of diverse backgrounds to come together as one. Jacob Narverud (b. 1986) holds degrees in voice and choral conducting.

Get on Board Little Children is another spiritual from the rich tradition of Black American worship. The music and text are unattributed and it was passed from church to church and family to family aurally. Greg Gilpin is an active composer and arranger who was born and educated in Missouri. He is in demand as a choral clinician and has composed commercials, church music, for Disney, and Broadway.

What a Friend We Have in Jesus uses the tune CONVERSE. The text was written in 1855 by Joseph Mendicott Scriven (1819-1886). Scriven was an Irish immigrant to Canada who often wrote hymn texts to find solace in his faith. His life was not altogether a happy one. Charles C. Converse (1832-1918) composed the hymn tune that bears his name in 1868. He also had two other pseudonyms. He was an American who studied in Leipzig, Germany, returned to America and became a lawyer. He remained an active musician throughout his life.

This Little Light of Mine has been a St. Pauls favorite for more than 40 years. It has an uplifting and spiritually powerful message that celebrates the sharing of faith. This is another example from the deep well of spirituals from the African American tradition. The arrangement that we are used to singing was created by Dr. Sammie "Sam" Hill, who was the Director of Music and Organist at St. Pauls from 1971-1991. Sam, and our current Director of Music, Kurt R. Hansen, both studied with the same teacher at Northwestern University, Grigg Fountain.
