



The United Church of Christ and the Disciples of Christ denominations issued a Joint Statement on the "Venezuela Takeover by the United States." The joint statement condemns recent military actions of the US regarding Venezuela and calls for "restraint, respect for sovereignty, and renewed commitment to peaceful, multilateral engagement." Per the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network, the UCC is a "just peace" denomination that stands for "diplomacy over domination, cooperation over coercion, and peace over war."

As they continue to work at supporting themselves financially, members of our migrant family friends would love to work for you. They are available for such tasks as house cleaning, handyman repairs, moving items, painting, deck-staining, demolition & clean-up, and carpentry on things like deck and dry-wall. We have been assigning work at a rate of \$25/hour and ask that the jobs be a minimum of 3-4 hours. Living On A \$10/ Day Food Allowance

Secretary of Agriculture Brooke Rollins claims that consumers can maintain a healthy diet for as little as \$3 a meal, intoning, "...it can cost around \$3/meal for a piece of chicken, a piece of broccoli, a corn tortilla and another thing."

Food prices increased by almost 1% in December of 2025, more than double the rate of inflation. Joel Berg, CEO of Hunger Free America notes, " The top reason people cannot afford food...is the price of everything else." When health care, rent, energy are all increasing, then the quality and quantity of food is compromised.


STEPHEN MINISTRY AT ST. PAULS







FROM BIBLE STORY THEATRE TO BIBLE OFF BROADWAY:

*A SHORT WALK THROUGH NEARLY 50 YEARS
OF BRINGING THE BIBLE TO LIFE THROUGH SAINT PAULS' TALENTED CHILDREN*

Bible Off Broadway (formerly "Bible Story Theatre") is rapidly approaching its 50th anniversary as an annual Saint Pauls Church youth-led event. We are now seeing the grandchildren of some of the original young participants cast as performers in modern-day BOB productions. Thus, it seems a good time to share a bit of history regarding this beloved Saint Pauls Church tradition.

The following two paragraphs tell the story of the genesis of the BST/BOB program, taken from the Sesquicentennial Saint Pauls history book *Making a Joyful Sound in the City* written in 1993 by our beloved late Pastor Emeritus Tom Henry.

"Bible Story Theatre began as a cooperative effort of St. Pauls Church and the Body Politic Theatre at 2261 N. Lincoln Avenue. At first it was an opportunity for Christian education to move outside the Sunday school classroom. Children beginning with Kindergarten age, along with parents, teachers, and any other interested church members, went to the theatre for a Bible story presentation by professional actors. Following the presentation, Rev. James Shiflett, Body Politic director, led the kids and adults in a discussion of what they had seen, heard, and learned. Then, the kids had an opportunity to join the actors in presenting the story again.

As the Sunday School grew rapidly in the 1980's, it no longer was possible to go to the Body Politic Theatre. Bible Story workshops and presentations moved to the church. Under the direction of Sharon Phillips, Bible Story Theatre became an annual production involving a month of Sunday morning workshops that culminated in the presentation of the Bible story in a worship service."

From the 1980's through about the mid-2010's, Bible Story Theatre mainly presented one Bible story per year, such as "Jonah and the Whale," "Genesis," and "Noah's Ark." Professionally-trained adult actors and a few selected high schoolers assumed the individual roles, memorizing a traditional play script written and directed by Sharon Phillips herself. The remaining kids and their "adult shepherds" participated in group roles, singing and dancing their assigned well-known song standards with cleverly-rewritten lyrics by Sharon and a few adult volunteers.

After Sharon's retirement in the mid-2010's, a small group of adult volunteer leaders took the reins and evolved the newly-dubbed Bible Off Broadway to have greater youth participation. Children rather than adults/professional actors were cast in the lion's share of the annual production's roles. Songs were mainly drawn from contemporary hits rather than "old standards" so that youth would be even more excited to perform their scenes and learn their music. And at times, as in this year, multiple Bible stories that fell under a single umbrella theme were staged, offering more kids more chances to play individual roles (and to teach the assembled cast and audience even more Bible stories!). And finally, a narration approach was adopted to enable the stories to be easier to follow and to take pressure off the kids, because they no longer were required to memorize lines of a script. Not only were the kids less stressed, but the audience could follow the stories far more easily through the narrators' microphoned words.

The BST/BOB tradition has resulted in nearly 50 years of "Making a Joyful Sound in the City" through the amazing talents, energy, and enthusiasm of nearly three generations of Saint Pauls youth. Ask any child from the 1970s through today, and they will remember their song and costume, the story they brought to life, and the memories they made by being a participant. And they will know that, to enunciate properly, one needs to say with precision, "*The lips, the teeth, the tip of the tongue!*" and "*Wooh, whoa, whar, wow!*"
